

CONTEXT: JEWS and CHRISTIANS in ACTS



Agreements

- Affirmation of the Jewish *ethnic* identity
- Affirmation of some Jewish religious customs
- Respected Jewish leaders
 - The Church resisted only when ordered to disobey God by Jewish leadership

Disagreements

- Jesus
- Interpretation of the Hebrew Scriptures
- View of Gentiles

Author: "the beloved" physician named Lucian

- (COLOSSIANS 4:14)
- 1. Brought to Christ by Paul?
- 2. The only Gentile writer in the New Testament
- 3. Luke joined Paul on some missionary trips
- 4. Luke is not witness to Jesus ministry

OVERVIEW: CONTINUED



Audience: The Greeks (Gentiles)

Specifically to Theophilus, a friend of Luke's and a Roman official



Key Phrase: ACTS 1:8

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

- 1. To "bridge" the Gospels and the Epistles
- 2. To establish the history of the early church
- 3. To strengthen Theophilus in his belief in Jesus



Key Phrase: ACTS 1:8

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

- 4. The resurrection of Jesus is the key to salvation
 - ACTS 1:8,22 | 2:24-32 | 5:30-32 | 10:40 | 13:30-39 | 17:18, 31 | 26:23
- 5. The Coming and Activity of the Holy Spirit
- 6. Prayer (or a form of it) is used 35 times in Acts



Key Phrase: ACTS 1:8

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

- 7. The ministry of the apostles (Paul and Peter)
 - Validity of Paul's Apostleship
 - Gentile inclusion into the new kingdom

- Judea ACTS 1-7

- Samaria ACTS 8-12

- Ends of the World ACTS 13-28



Key Phrase: ACTS 1:8

- 9. Women mentioned/emphasized frequently
- 10. Old Testament Referenced in Acts




