Peter was resurrected...and he too was seen as extremely dangerous | ACTS 7:57-60

Paul was resurrected...and was martyred by most powerful political force in the world

RESURRECTION **PERSECUTION**

Resurrected people are in a constant state of rebellion against the world, leading to persecution.





PERSECUTION RESUBICION

Persecution is the effort to use doubt, despair, and even death to nullify the resurrected life.







But death cannot defeat a resurrected people, who know they have already been raised from the dead by the merciful hand of God.
