The Nicene Creed

"We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary,

and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen. "

Holy

"Pure, perfect, without fault, morally good, having divine quality."

1 JOHN 1:5

This is the message we have heard from him and declare to you: God is light, and in him there is no darkness at all.

- 1. Holiness is God's very being
- 2. Holiness is at the heart of God's self-revelation
- 3. Holiness is always derived and dependent upon one's proximity or relationship to a Holy God

Truths

- 1. Holiness of Christ is the standard for the Christian
- 2. Holiness true for the church because of what has happened, not because of what the church has done

ROMANS 5:6-9

⁶ For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. ⁷ For one will scarcely die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person one would dare even to die— ⁸ but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. ⁹ Since, therefore, we have now been justified by his blood, much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God.

Catholic

Apostolic

It is founded on the teachings of Jesus' apostles.

EPHESIANS 2:20

built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone

1 JOHN 2:19-20

¹⁹ They went out from us, but they were not of us; for if they had been of us, they would have continued with us. But they went out, that it might become plain that they all are not of us. ²⁰ But you have been anointed by the Holy One, and you have knowledge.

The church is composed of true and false believers
The doctrine of perseverance – MATTHEW 7:21-23

The Church and the **Kingdom**

The Kingdom of God is The Reign of God

- 1. The Church is **not** the Kingdom
- 2. The Kingdom creates the Church
- 3. The Church witnesses to the Kingdom
- 4. The Church is the instrument of the Kingdom
- 5. The church is the custodian of the Kingdom



Other Understandings for Clarity

The Church and Israel

Redemptive History – epic promise into epic fulfillment

God's people are no longer defined genealogically, they are defined Christologically.

JOHN 8 | ROMANS 2

So, does the Church replace Israel? [NO]
The ultimate expression of Judaism is following Jesus.


