Hebrews 12:24

**to Jesus the mediator of a new covenant,
and to the sprinkled blood that speaks a
better word than the blood of Abel.**

Hebrews 12:25

See to it that you do not refuse him who speaks. If they did not escape when they refused him who warned them on earth,

Hebrews 12:25cont.

**how much less will we, if we turn away
from him who warns us from heaven?**

H E B R E W S

Hebrews 12:26

At that time his voice shook the earth, but now he has promised, "Once more I will shake not only the earth but also the heavens."

Hebrews 12:27

The words “once more” indicate the removing of what can be shaken—that is, created things—so that what cannot be shaken may remain.

Hebrews 12:28

Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, let us be thankful, and so worship God acceptably with reverence and awe,
